## **Central Anti-Corruption** Bureau

The Central Anti-Corruption Bureau is a special service established to **combat corruption** in public and economic life, particularly in public and local government institutions, as well as to fight against activities detrimental to the State's economic interests.



CBA conducts its activities under the Act of 9 June 2006 on the Central Anti-Corruption Bureau (Journal of Laws 2025, item 712, consolidated text).

#### ACT

#### of 9 June 2006

#### ON THE CENTRAL ANTI-CORRUPTION BUREAU

#### Chapter 1

#### General provisions

#### Art. 1

- The Central Anti-Corruption Bureau, hereinafter referred to as the "CBA", is created as a special service to combat corruption in public and economic life, particularly in public and local government institutions as well as to fight against activities detrimental to the State's economic interests.
- 2. The Central Anti-Corruption Bureau is exclusively entitled to use the name Central Anti-Corruption Bureau and its acronym - the "CBA".
- 3a. Within the meaning of the Act, corruption means an act which:
  - 1) involves promising, proposing or giving by any persons, directly or indirectly, of any undue advantage to a person performing a public function for themselves or any other person, in return for acting or omission to act in performing the person's function;
  - 2) involves demanding or accepting by a person performing a public function, directly or indirectly, of any undue advantage for themselves or any other person, or accepting an offer or promise of such advantage in return for acting or omission to act in performing the person's function;
  - 3) is perpetrated in the course of business, covering the accomplishment of the obligations towards the public authority (institution), involving promising, proposing or giving, directly or indirectly, of any undue advantage to a person who manages a unit which does not belong to the public finance sector, or who works for the benefit of this unit in any capacity, for themselves or any other person, in return for acting or omission to act, which breaches their obligations and constitutes a socially detrimental reciprocity;
  - 4) is perpetrated in the course of business, covering the accomplishment of the obligations towards the public authority (institution), involving demanding or accepting, directly or indirectly, of any undue advantage by a person who manages a unit which does not belong to the public finance sector, or who works for the benefit of this unit in any capacity, for themselves or any other person, in return for acting or omission to act, which breaches their obligations and constitutes a socially detrimental reciprocity.
- 3. Within the meaning of the Act, an activity deemed detrimental to the State's economic interests is any conduct, which may result in serious damage, within the meaning of Art. 115 § 7 of the Act of 6 June 1997 - The Penal Code (Journal of Laws No. 88, item 553, as amended), to the property of:

### **Head of the CBA**

**The Head of the Central Anti-Corruption Bureau** is a central authority of the government administration supervised by the Prime Minister, acting with the assistance of the CBA, which is an office of the government administration.

The Head of the CBA is appointed for **a term of four years** and is recalled by the Prime Minister following a consultation with the President of the Republic of Poland, the Special Services Committee and the Parliamentary Committee for Special Services.

#### The Head of the CBA may be reappointed only once.

Upon the motion of the Head of the CBA, the Prime Minister appoints and recalls the Deputies of the Head of the CBA.

The function of the Head of the CBA or of the Deputy Head of the CBA shall not be combined with another public function.

The Head of the CBA or the Deputy Heads of the CBA shall not remain in an employment relationship with another employer or undertake another remunerative activity outside of the service. Moreover, they shall not be members of a political party or participate in the activities of that party or on its behalf.

# **Head of the CBA Tomasz Strzelczyk**

**Tomasz Strzelczyk** has been appointed Head of the CBA on 9 April 2025. He is a distinguished officer, experienced in the area of combating corruption crimes and activities detrimental to the State's economic interests.



In the years 1992-2015 **he served in the Police**, among others in departments dealing with combating economic and drug-related crimes. He finished his service with a rank of Lieutenant-Colonel as **the Head of the Department in the Central Investigation Bureau**. In the years 2015-2020 he was an officer of the Central Anti-Corruption Bureau in the Regional Office of the CBA in Warsaw, where he held the position of **the Head of the Operations and Investigations Department**.

From 30 January 2024 to 27 February 2025 he served as **Deputy Head of the Central Anti-Corruption Bureau**. From 28 February to 8 April 2025 he performed duties of the Head of the CBA.

### **Staff of the CBA**

As for the day of 31 December 2024, the Bureau has employed **1117 people**, including **926 officers and 191 civil servants** who are high class professionals in the areas related to the implementation of the tasks of the service.



### Tasks of the CBA

#### The tasks of the CBA comprise:

- identification, prevention and detection of offences laid down in art. 2, paragraph 1, item 1 of the Act on the CBA **venality, bribery, trading influence and misconduct in public office** and prosecution of perpetrators of such offences),
- disclosure and prevention of cases of non-compliance with the limitation of conducting economic activities by person performing public functions,
- documenting the grounds for and initiating implementation of the provisions on the reimbursement of unjustly obtained benefits at the expense of the State Treasury or other public legal entities,
- disclosure of cases of **non-compliance** with certain provisions of law-making procedures and **implementation of decisions concerning, above all, privatisation and commercialisation, financial support, awarding public procurement,** etc.,
- control of the correctness and truthfulness of asset declarations or statements on conducting economic activities by persons performing public functions,
- conducting analytical activities.

## **Activities performed by the CBA's officers**

Within the scope of the tasks referred to in the Act, the CBA officers perform:



operational activities



control activities



investigative activities



analytical and informative activities

## **Operational activities**

**Operational intelligence** is performed by the officers of the CBA in order to **detect corruptive crimes or prevent the perpetration of crimes** as well as to obtain and process information relevant to combating corruption in state institutions and local government and also activities detrimental to the State's economic interest.

In case of a justified suspicion of a commission of a crime, the CBA officers perform investigative activities specified by the provisions of the Code of Criminal Procedure, including activities ordered by court and the prosecutor.



#### In 2024, 1,091 preventive measures were applied, such as:

- **314** police supervision,
- 267 financial sureties,
- 235 ban on contacting with aggrieved parties,
- 118 ban on leaving the country,
- 80 suspension from duties or ban on the practice of the profession,
- 66 temporary detention,
- 6 ban on staying in certain places,
- 5 ban on performing certain activities or a ban on driving.



As a result of the investigations conducted in 2024, **313 people have been detained**.

**866 suspects** were charged for the first time.

A total of **2,375 charges** were made in the conducted investigations.



#### **COMBATING CORRUPTION**

Operational and investigative activities were directed at identifying, detecting and preventing corruption threats and offences committed by public officials and other persons performing public functions.

**285 of the investigations** conducted in 2024 were related to corruption.

As part of these proceedings, **359 persons** acquired a status of a suspect. Property worth close to **PLN 194 million, over EUR 96,000 and over USD 23,000 was secured**.

The estimated value of disclosed financial benefits amounted to PLN 14,300,000.

#### **COMBATING ECONOMIC CRIMES**

One of the CBA's statutory tasks is to identify, prevent and detect offences against i.a. tax obligations if they are committed in connection with corruption or activities detrimental to the State's economic interest.

In 2024, the CBA conducted **142 preparatory proceedings into tax extortion.** 

As a result of these activities, **377 persons** acquired a status of a suspect.

Property worth over **PLN 158,600,000** was secured.

The loss to the State Treasury amounted to over **PLN 65 million**.



## **Control** activities

**The aim of control activities** conducted by the CBA officers is **the disclosure of corruption cases** in public institutions, fraudulent practices of persons performing public functions and **activities detrimental to the State's economic interests**.

#### **Control activities cover:**

- disclosure of cases of non-adherence of the law, for example in the scope of issuing economic decisions (among others: privatization, financial support, disposal of state and municipal assets, public procurement), as well as counteracting it,
- verification of the correctness and truthfulness of asset declarations or statements on conducting economic activities by persons performing public actions.

#### Control activities performed by the CBA's officers in 2024:



20

**675** pre-control analyses

641 control cases

Among above-mentioned activities as many as **48 control cases**, **97** analyses and **21 controls concerned extortion of EU funds**.

In the course of controls and analytical-informative activities, the officers of control proceedings disclosed damage to the State Treasury or exposure to such damage amounted to nearly PLN 277,800,000.

#### **CONTROLS**

Controls are conducted on the basis of the annual control plan, approved by the Head of the CBA or – if necessary – on an ad hoc basis.

#### Types of controls conducted in 2024:

#### planned controls (36):

17 – economic decisions, 19 – asset declarations,

#### ad hoc controls (82):

39 – economic decisions, 43 – asset declarations.



The initiation of control proceedings was most often preceded by analytical and informative activities in the form of **pre-control analyses (108).** 

#### **CONTROLS OF ECONOMIC DECISIONS**

In 2024, 56 controls included an examination of the procedures for making and implementing economic decisions, defined by law.

## The main scopes of controls of making and implementing decisions:



financial support



public procurements



disposal of state or municipal property



disposal of public funds

These controls resulted in **13 notices** of reasonable suspicion of a crime.

**In 5 cases**, materials were forwarded to ongoing preparatory proceedings.

Additionally, **5 reports** were sent to the Public Finance Discipline Ombudsman, **2 notices** were sent to the Customs and Tax Office and **11 irregularity notifications** were forwarded to other competent authorities.

#### PRE-CONTROL ANALYSES

Pre-control analyses conducted by the CBA's officers in 2024:

**641** pre-control analyses

concerning procedures of making and implementing economic decisions

concerning asset declarations and following anti-corruption provisions

In 2024, the findings of analyses of the economic decisions, asset declarations and following of the anti-corruption provisions enabled, among others, **19 notices to be sent on suspicion of a crime**.

#### **CONTROL CASES**

In 2024, the CBA conducted 675 control cases.

Control cases were initiated mostly on the basis of anonymous (144) and onymous (144) irregularity notifications.

#### **ASSET DECLARATIONS**

In 2024, CBA officers conducted **62 controls, 195 pre-control analyses and 217 control cases** concerning asset declarations.

The biggest professional group being under control were municipal government officials.

As a result of controls carried out, **7 notices on reasonable suspicion** of a crime were filed.

CBA is **the only special service** having a tool in the form of control of asset declarations and economic decisions.

Asset declaration is an important preventive tool which leads to transparency among people performing public functions. The obligation to submit them is regulated by more than 20 legal acts. Up to half million people in Poland submit asset declarations every year.

Implementing the order of the Minister Coordinator of Special Services, in coordination with other special services, CBA has been working on **a draft legal act** regulation unification, digitisation and control of asset declarations.

Accordingly, in December 2024, the Bureau organised a conference entitled "Asset Declarations. Digitisation. Unification. Control". The event was held under the honorary patronage of the Minister of the Interior and Administration, Minister of National Defence and Minister of Digital Affairs. The conference gathered a broad

audience of specialists from Poland and abroad, enabling a platform for exchanging the best international practices. It was also an opportunity to learn the perspective of civil society represented by non-governmental organisations focused on anti-corruption issues.



As part of the educational campaign, a website **oswiadczeniamajatkowe.cba.gov.pl** was launched. It is a platform for all those seeking advice and information on asset declarations – how to fill in the declarations and the applicable legal regulations.

## **Analytical** activities

The Central Anti-Corruption Bureau conducts analytical activities concerning phenomena taking place in the area of the Bureau's competences.

The results are reported to the Prime Minister, the President of the Republic of Poland, the Sejm and Senat.

The primary objectives of analytical and informative activities conducted by the CBA officers:

> identification of threats detrimental to the State's economic interest.

informing the authorities about the threats in advance.

formulating suggestions for countermeasures.

Moreover, analytical activities are supported by operational intelligence, investigative and control activities.

The result of the Bureau's analytical activities in 2024 was the preparation of 800 analytical studies, including:

- 393 crime analysis reports,
- notes from criminal analysis,
- analytical notes,
- signal information,
- letters of findings,
- special reports,
- analytical report.

In 2024, as a result of the activities of the analysts at the CBA, 2 notices of suspicion of a crime were filed.

#### ANTI-CORRUPTION SHIELD

A particular form of preventive activity in which the CBA is involved is the so-called **anti-corruption shield**.

It is a set of analytical activities aimed at identifying and counteracting corruption and activities detrimental to the State's economic interest. The origins of the shield date back to 2008, when, on the recommendation of the Prime Minister, heads of the special services launched the development of a system to protect privatisation and public procurement processes.

The value of the undertaking covered by the anti-corruption shield cannot be less than PLN 150 million but exceptionally a lower value is allowed. Three special services, namely CBA, Internal Security Agency (ABW) and Military Counterintelligence Service (SKW) are in charge of providing anti-corruption shield. CBA covers undertakings in the fields of ICT (Information Communication Technology), telecommunications and health care.

In 2024, CBA conducted shielding activities in regard to **49 undertakings**. It resulted in gathering information on the possibility of a conflict of interest of high-ranking official or the detection of irregularities related to the procedure of a draft regulation to the Gambling Act.



Anti-corruption shield covered, among others:

- modernisation and extension of the barrier along the Belarusian border – CBA officers verified 106 subcontractors applying for participation in the investment, of which 10 received a negative opinion and 11 received objections;
- procurements awarded in connection with the Polish Presidency of the Council of the European Union – CBA assisted in the interpretation of regulations, conducted trainings among representatives of 70 institutions and verified 166 contractors. The total value of procurements covered by the activities amounted to nearly PLN 200 million.

The Bureau also undertook a number of analytical activities concerning other occurrences within the jurisdiction of the service. They led to the findings, such as:

- a conflict of interests of a member of the management in one
  of the government administration offices and the director
  of a public finance sector unit,
- lobbying activities of former high-ranking public officials in favour of a company applying for public funds,
- irregularities in applications for educational subsidies.

Additionally, in connection with the implementation of statutory activities concerning the investigation of the conflict of interest among particular bodies functioning within the Ministry of Health and Ministry of National Defence, CBA officers **verified 2,772 declarations** and statements made by persons participating in the works of these groups in 2024.

## **Preventive** activities

Within the scope of its activity, the CBA conducts preventive and educational initiatives. In this regard, it cooperates with other institutions and non-governmental organizations dealing with the subject of corruption.

Preventive activities are carried out through:

- organizing trainings,
- · running an e-learning platform,
- issuing publications,
- · conducting educational campaigns.



## Anti-Corruption Training Courses

Since 2010, the CBA officers have conducted training courses for employees of government and public administration institutions and companies with State Treasury shareholding, as well as workshops for children and youth.

## **CBA e-learning platform**

It is open-access, free platform with anti-corruption training courses for all people interested in anti-corruption issues, especially for public officials, entrepreneurs, students and pupils.

Its primary goal is to **spread knowledge about corruption and to promote good practices** in preventing and combating corruption.

#### It contains three training modules:

- 1. Corruption in public administration,
- 2. Corruption in business,
- 3. Counteracting corruption.

The platform is available in **Polish and English** language versions.

Each module is completed with a knowledge test. Once completed, you can generate a certificate confirming the completion of the training.

Until the end of 2024, a total of **364,776 training courses** have been conducted.

## Anti-corruption publications

The CBA issued more than 60 publications in Polish and 20 – in English.

#### These are, among others:

- handbooks for officials and entrepreneurs,
- · post-conference publications,
- CBA Information Booklets,
- Anti-corruption bulletins,
- · Corruption Maps,
- specialised handbooks on, for example, crime analysis,
- recommendations on the public procurement proceedings.

## **18 lectures for 18 years** of the CBA

In 2024, almost 6,000 pupils and students participated in the meetings entitled "Coming of age in the service. Together for the honest State".

The lectures were held at 18 public universities with which the Bureau carries out educational programmes to foster ethical and civic attitudes.

During each of the meetings, students learnt about the specifics of the CBA's activities, anti-corruption shield and criminal, strategic and intelligence analysis, as well as the ways to report corruption.

### **International cooperation**

In order to accomplish the tasks of the CBA, the Head of the Central Anti-Corruption Bureau may undertake cooperation with competent authorities and services of other States as well as with international organisations. The undertaking of the cooperation, referred to the Act on the Central Anti-Corruption Bureau, may take place after the receipt of consent of the Prime Minister.

The CBA cooperates with **54 countries** and **13 international organisations** from all over the world. The cooperation aims to **exchange the best practices, extend the knowledge on corruption**, solutions and instruments applied abroad, as well as to exchange information on current operational and investigative activities conducted by foreign services.

In 2024, CBA representatives participated in many international meetings, for example in 21st International Anti-Corruption Conference IACC in Vilnius or 23rd EPAC/EACN Conference.



One of the most important international events organised by the CBA in 2024 was **the High Level Meeting of the Heads of the Anti-Corruption Authorities.** 

At the invitation of the Head of the CBA, representatives of the most important anti-corruption institutions from the region met in Wrocław to discuss key challenges and the planned efforts to combat corruption. The meeting aimed to strengthen international cooperation, exchange experiences and jointly discuss new effective tools in the fight against corruption.

The conference was attended by representatives of services from Estonia, Iceland, Lithuania, Latvia and Sweden.

## CBA Centre in Lucień


#### **#ABCintegrity**

The project involves broad and multi-stage promotion of the idea of integrity. It is based on three principles relating to different stages of human development:

A – promoting the idea of integrity and ethics among the youngest,

- B cooperating with the scientific community and organizing anti-corruption events for recent college students who are about to begin their careers,
- C conducting specialized training for public sector employees and representatives of commercial companies with State Treasury participation.

On 3 November 2023, at the EPAC/EACN General Assembly with the participation of nearly two hundred delegates of European anti-corruption institutions, the #ABCintegrity Project was recognized as the best anti-corruption initiative in 2023.





Every year, the Centre provides advanced, specialised and basic trainings for officers and civil servants of the CBA.




## **Charity work**
